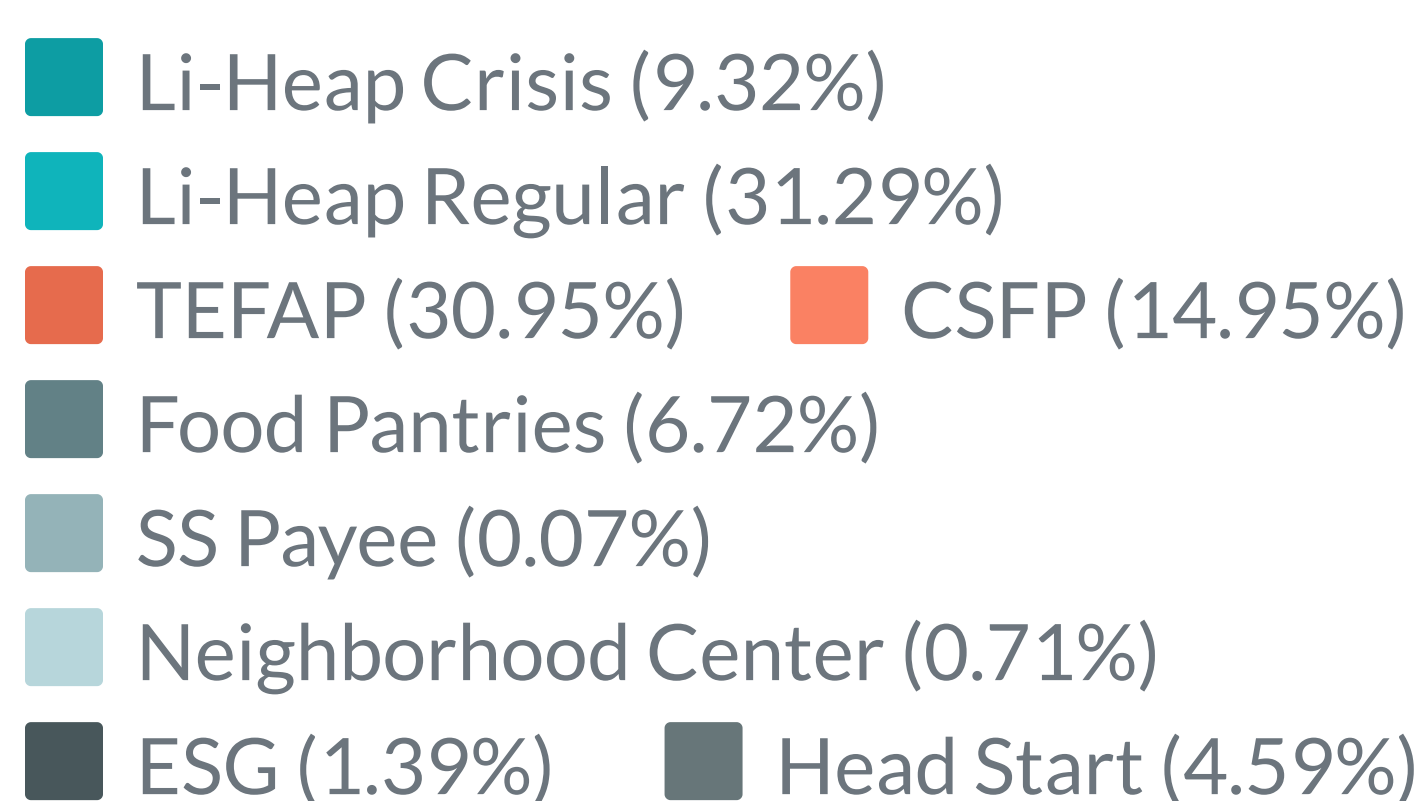
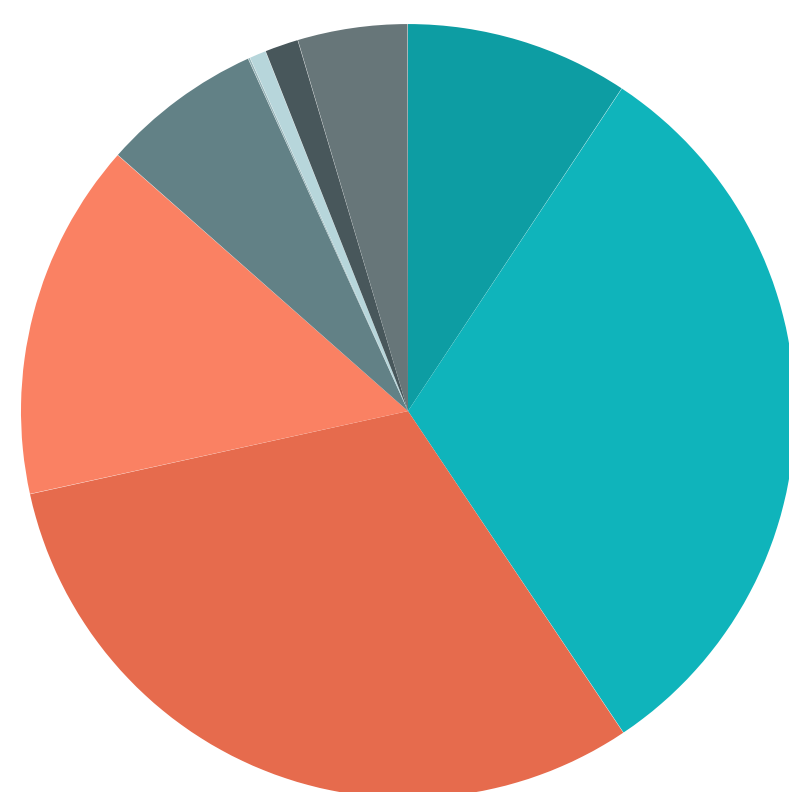

% of children with IEP

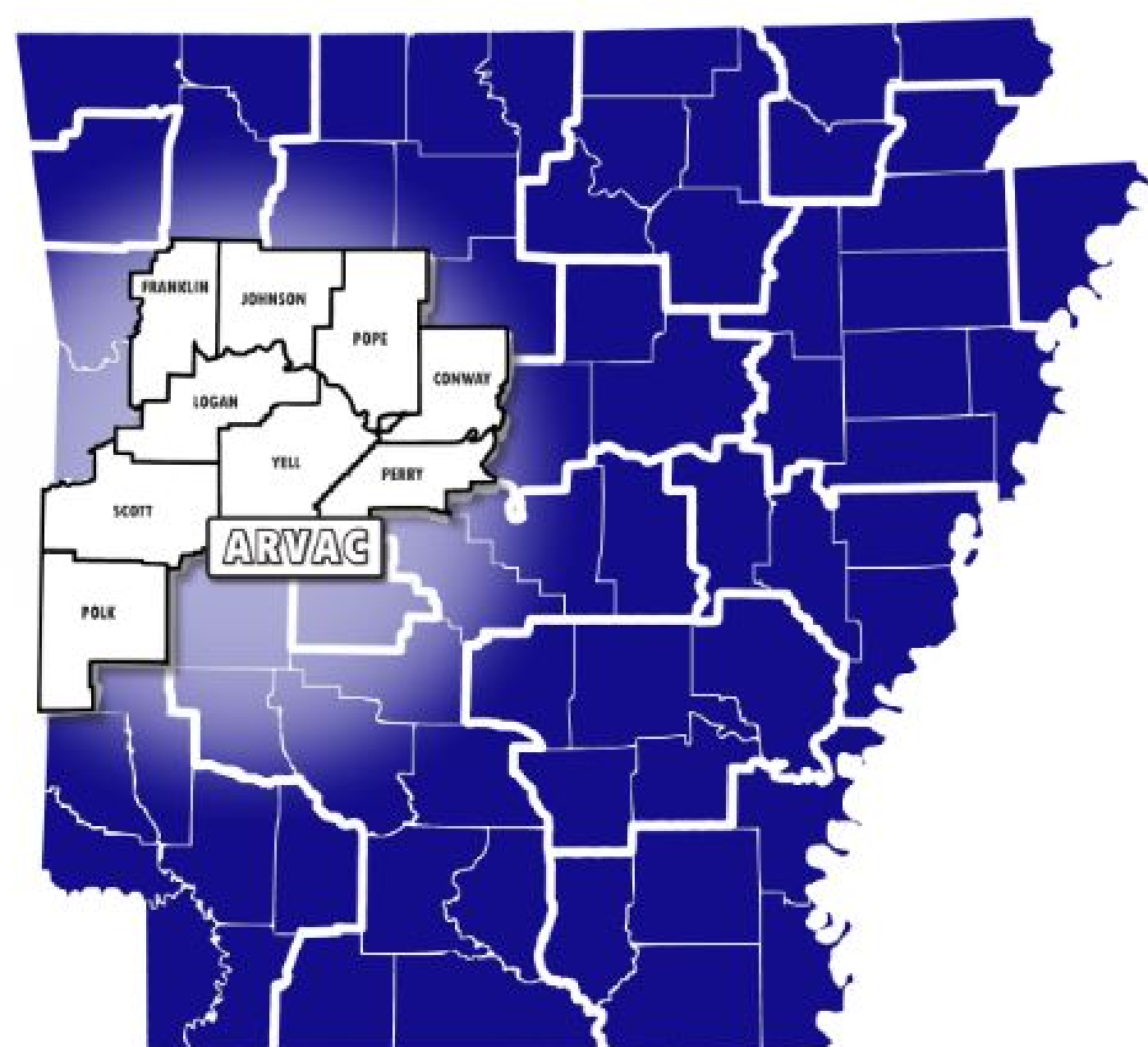

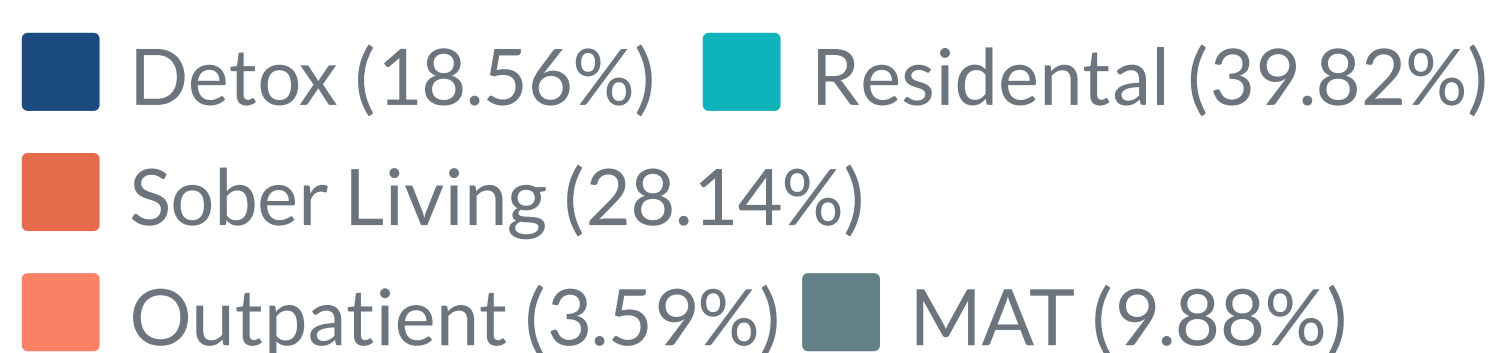
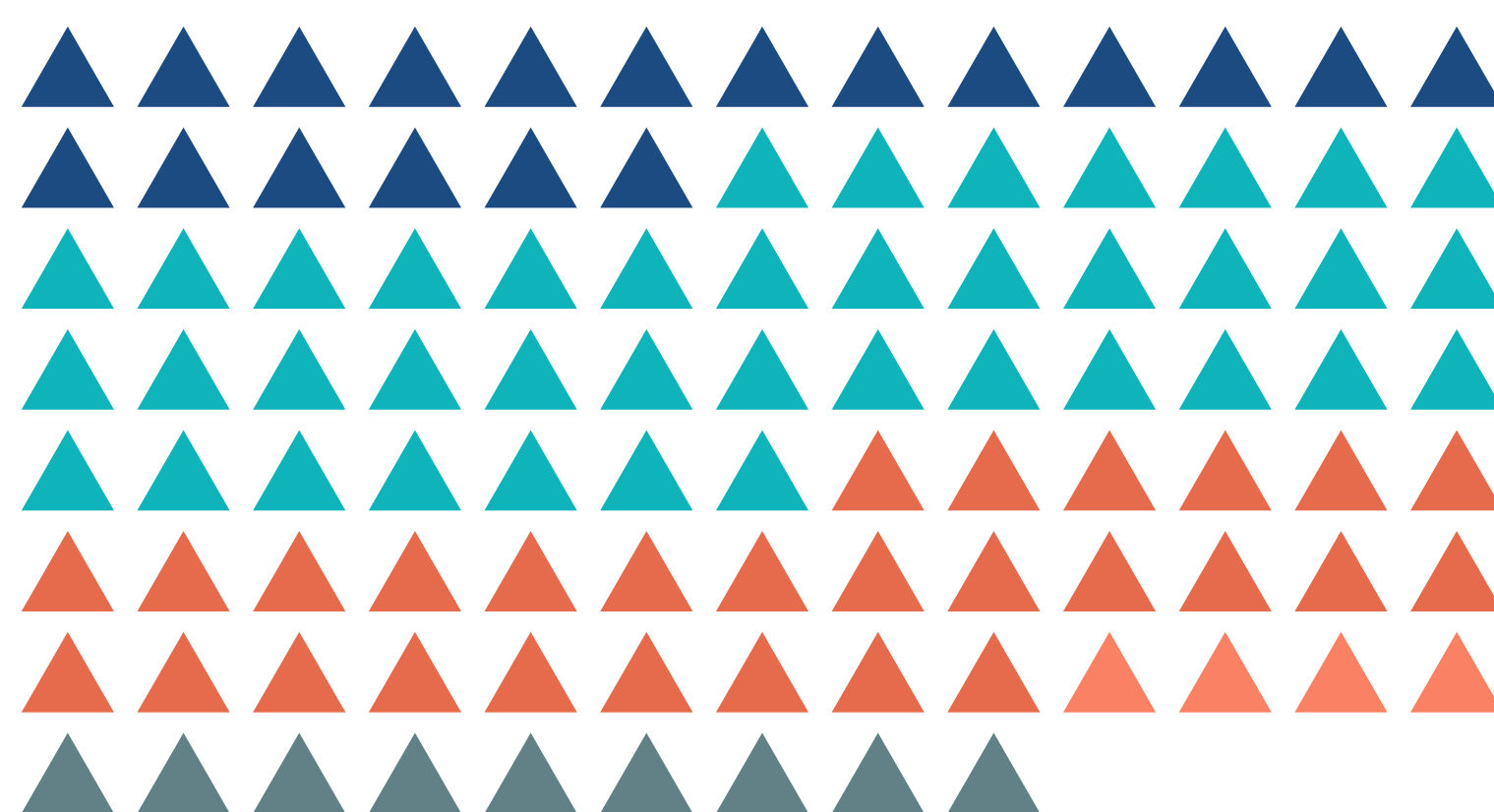
